

Teacher of the Year Nomination Form

Each year at the annual conference, UFLA recognizes up to three outstanding language teachers as Teacher of the Year—one teacher for elementary, one for secondary, and one for post-secondary. The nominees teach any language or combination of languages, with a minimum of 3/5 of their teaching responsibilities dedicated to teaching language. To be considered, nominees must have taught a language in Utah for a minimum of three years. Membership in UFLA at the time of nomination is not required. If selected as Teacher of the Year, the candidate must join UFLA prior to the conference.

A cover sheet and teaching portfolio must be submitted to Teresa Bell (tbell@byu.edu) no later than **December 15, 2023.**
