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Since this will be my last "President's Message," I want to thank you all for the opportunity you've given me to stay involved in UFLA and to know so many of the fine teachers that we have in our schools. Last semester I had the good fortune to observe an excellent teacher while I was working with a student teacher in Spanish II. Often we, as foreign language teachers, fall into the trap of teaching what is most easily tested, and getting bogged down in verb conjugations and the forms of pronouns, on translating words or sentences and memorizing vocabulary. In the class that I observed, however, the goal of proficiency and competent communication had not been lost. Students spoke with the teacher and with each other. They listened to native models on video and interacted with the language live on the internet.

Occasionally, when I visit a school and say "Buenos días. ¿Cómo están?" to students before or after class, they look at me startled, like deer caught in headlights, obviously unaccustomed to hearing Spanish, let alone speaking it. It saddens me that there are some

FL News

Utah has been chosen as one of eight states to receive a \$300,000 grant from the federal government to encourage students to take a more rigorous program of study during their high school years.

Students will be expected to sign a Utah Scholars commitment to take the following:

- 4 years of English
- 4 years of math
- 3 years of science
- 3 1/2 years of social studies
- 2 years of a language other than English

Students who complete the program with a "B" average will receive special recognition at graduation as well as guaranteed admittance into Utah's public colleges and universities without presenting any ACT/SAT scores. There is a possibility that they may also receive scholarships.

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UFLA Teacher Vitality Award Winner

Online collaboration for Spanish teachers.

Last year at UFLA, several of us were talking about combining resources to create a wider base of online activities / exercises available for our students throughout the state. As the Internet explodes in accessibility and popularity, it seems that we could use it to great advantage in providing better practice materials for our students.

To this end, <u>I applied for a UFLA Teacher Vitality Award</u> last Spring and have since begun compiling a collection of exercises that I have found and used in my classes over the last several years. Many of the exercises are either text- or teacher-specific, yet there is some great material available for teachers needing or wanting extra practice material for their students.

My invitation to fellow Spanish (and other language) teachers is this. If each of us, using our favorite programs such as powerpoint, flash, dreamweaver, hot potatoes, game creators, etc. were to create 1 new quality activity per year and then make that available to our fellow colleagues, we could have an impressive collection of practice material available with very little individual work. One of my favorite programs for generating online quizzes (including matching, short answer, crossword puzzles, word scrambles, etc.) is a free program, hot potatoes. It can be downloaded free of charge at http://hotpot.uvic.ca/. Once created, exercises can then be easily uploaded for student use. With my personal students, I allow them to go to these quizzes / games / etc. for remediation or bonus points when needed to improve mastery in a subject. They also go for quiz or test preparation. These are similar to Quia activities except they are transportable.

The website I have established for these activities is at http://www.utahspanish.com/recursos/. This site will remain free for all teachers and students in Utah to access. On the site, I have also included source files for hot potatoes documents in case you wish to modify elements. I have hundreds of exercises that I am tweaking and uploading, but I would invite anyone interested in contributing documents, games, files, etc. to send either the source file, compiled file or link (if they are hosted elsewhere such as Quia) to me at richard@utahspanish.com. I will then add the exercises to the site, organizing as needed by thematic, structural or content relevancy.

Imagine what we could do together if we all shared our best resources. That's my hope. Thanks to UFLA for giving me the push to get this project off the ground. Please contact me if you have suggestions or submissions.


TEACHER OF THE YEAR NOMINATE NOW!

If you know an outstanding foreign language teacher, please consider nominating him or her as the Utah Foreign Language Teacher of the Year. Nominees may teach any foreign language or combination of foreign languages, with a minimum of 3/5 of their teaching duties being carried out within these disciplines. They may teach in a public or private institution at either the elementary, secondary or college/university levels. Membership in UFLA is not required for nomination, but if selected as Teacher of the Year the candidate must join UFLA and register for the Annual Conference 3 weeks in advance.
