

Teacher of the Year

If you know an outstanding foreign language teacher, please consider nominating him or her as the <u>Utah Foreign Language Teacher of the Year</u>. Nominees may teach any foreign language or combination of foreign languages, with a minimum of 3/5 of their teaching duties being carried out within these disciplines. They may teach in a public or private institution at either the elementary, secondary, or college/university levels. Membership in UFLA is not required for nomination, but if selected as Teacher of the Year the candidate must join UFLA and register for the Annual Conference. (In this case, the October mini-conference.)

The UFLA Teacher of the Year becomes the state's nominee for **SWCOLT Teacher of the Year**, and UFLA will pay expenses to attend the SWCOLT 2007 meeting in Salt Lake City. Information about the SWCOLT Teacher of the Year is available at http://www.swcolt.org/toy.htm


Staff the exhibit hall main booth and make sure the exhibitors are comfortable and cared for.
